

Y10 ART CURRICULUM PROGRESSION OVERVIEW

Success at KS4 is entirely due to a thorough foundation in drawing, the use of lots of materials and an understanding of how to work in and organise a sketchbook/prep sheets. KS4 builds on students' strengths that they have developed in the previous three years. Year 10 is coursework based where students will learn more new techniques and build more knowledge surrounding contextual studies. As the course progresses, the students will begin to produce more independent and individual responses in their work. The aim of the KS4 curriculum is to enable students' to discover their creative strengths and to build upon them. The curriculum becomes increasingly individualised and planned to each student's abilities and strengths. Group size permitting this allows a safe and inclusive environment for SEND and PP students. Students will experience 1:1 tutorials and individual records of each student's work will be kept and closely monitored to ensure that they succeed in their studies In Art and Design. The key to success at GCSE Art and Design is a well organised and maintained sketchbook/prep sheets. Homework becomes increasingly important as the course progresses.

Why this learning now?	Year 10 is a highly structured course where learners are required to complete specific exercises which are designed to expand their technical skill set. They complete a three-half term project called Circles. Each element of this project fulfils the assessment objectives of AQA GCSE Art and Design. They are critical contextual, experiment and research, design and complete a final piece. Great care is taken with presenting this work in a sketchbook or on preparatory sheets. Activities have been designed to enable every child to access them successfully. From the fourth and fifth half terms, learners start the face project. This focuses on increasingly sophisticated drawing and technical skills whilst nurturing independence. They are also presented with different concepts and ideas about Art. The function of Year 10 for all learners is to work out where creative strengths are, this will be built upon in Year 11. Homework becomes increasingly important as the year progresses as students become more independent.					
Assessment Opportunities:	Wherever possible, every lesson has one of the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Self-assessment opportunities (set against Exam mark scheme) these are visible to the students and act as success criteria. - Formative assessment from teachers (set against Exam mark schemes) - Links to artists and art history. Formative/verbal feedback is regularly provided via one to one and in groups, focusing on how to improve, make progress, small next steps and the final outcome. One to one tuition throughout the course at regular intervals with written feedback and next steps. Final assessment is internally assessed. Exam project in Y11 plus any coursework from Y10.
